## How to Read the Textbook

These are just a few suggestions:

- 1. Read it on a regularly timed basis; don't wait until the last minute to read everything.
- 2. Don't just read it, *work* it. You need to fill in the details as you go along.
- 3. When reading the examples you should realize that there are some steps that are left out. You should fill in those steps.
- 4. If the book says that some result follows from some previous results, try to work out that connection.
- 5. Draw pictures that illustrate the ideas that are being presented.
- 6. Think about how the material relates to, is similar to, or is unlike other material, both in the book being read and in other books/courses.
- 7. Compare the book's presentation of a topic to the professor's presentation: How are they similar? How are the different?
- 8. After reading a chapter/section at a detailed level, go back and read it at a high level and draw a graphic that maps out the interconnections between the main points covered: What implies what? How are things connected? Etc.
